

EE21 Early Engagement For Youths Under 21

INSIDE-OUT Beauty Programme with A4 (Singapore Prison) July - Sept 2019

Over the last 6 years, we have been running our signature Inside-Out Beauty Programme in A4 (formerly known as Changi Women's Prison) and we had just completed another run of the program which was attended by 10 inmates. Positive feedbacks were well-received and many felt that they can relate to the topics taught. This program serves as an initial contact point for us with these inmates who will be released from the prison within the next 3 - 6 months, during which they may need residential care & support.

HIGH TEA on Aug 17, 2019

The recent release of the Singapore Mental Health Study conducted by the Institute of Mental Health in 2019 revealed that there is an increasing

prevalence of mental illness in individuals between ages 18-34 and individuals who are divorced or separated. Hence, GEM invited industry experts in the mental health and counselling profession to share

insights into a better understanding of depression by organising a high tea event which saw a good turnout of 60 women of different ages.
